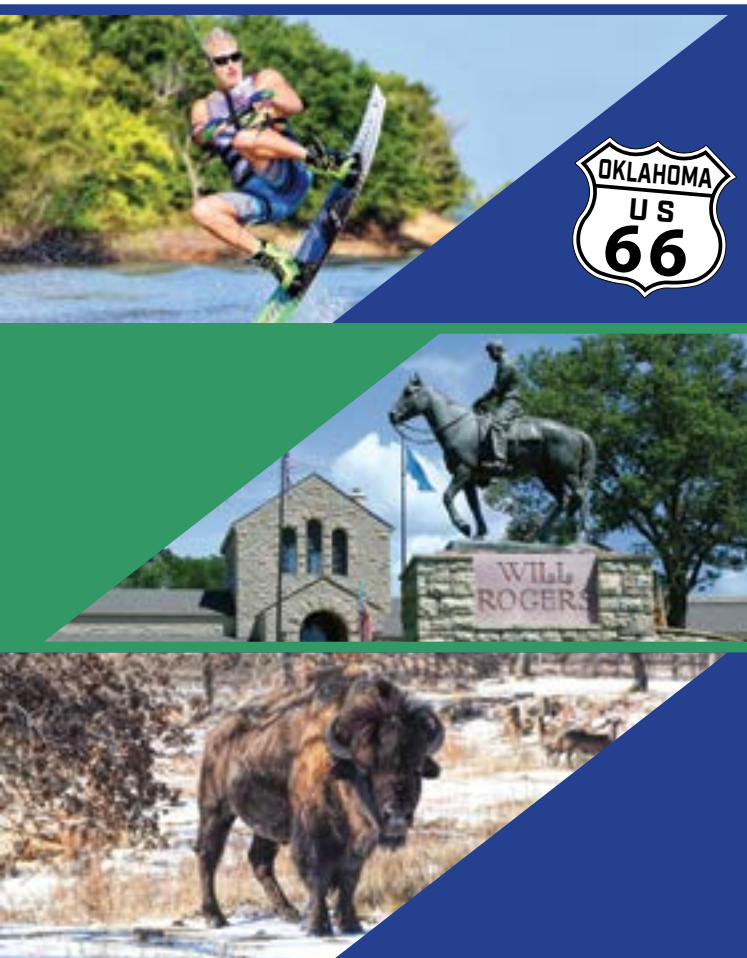

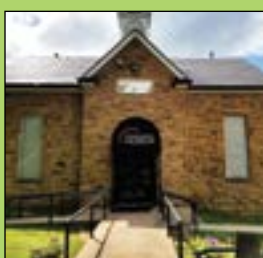

### 7 OSAGE NATION MUSEUM (ONM)

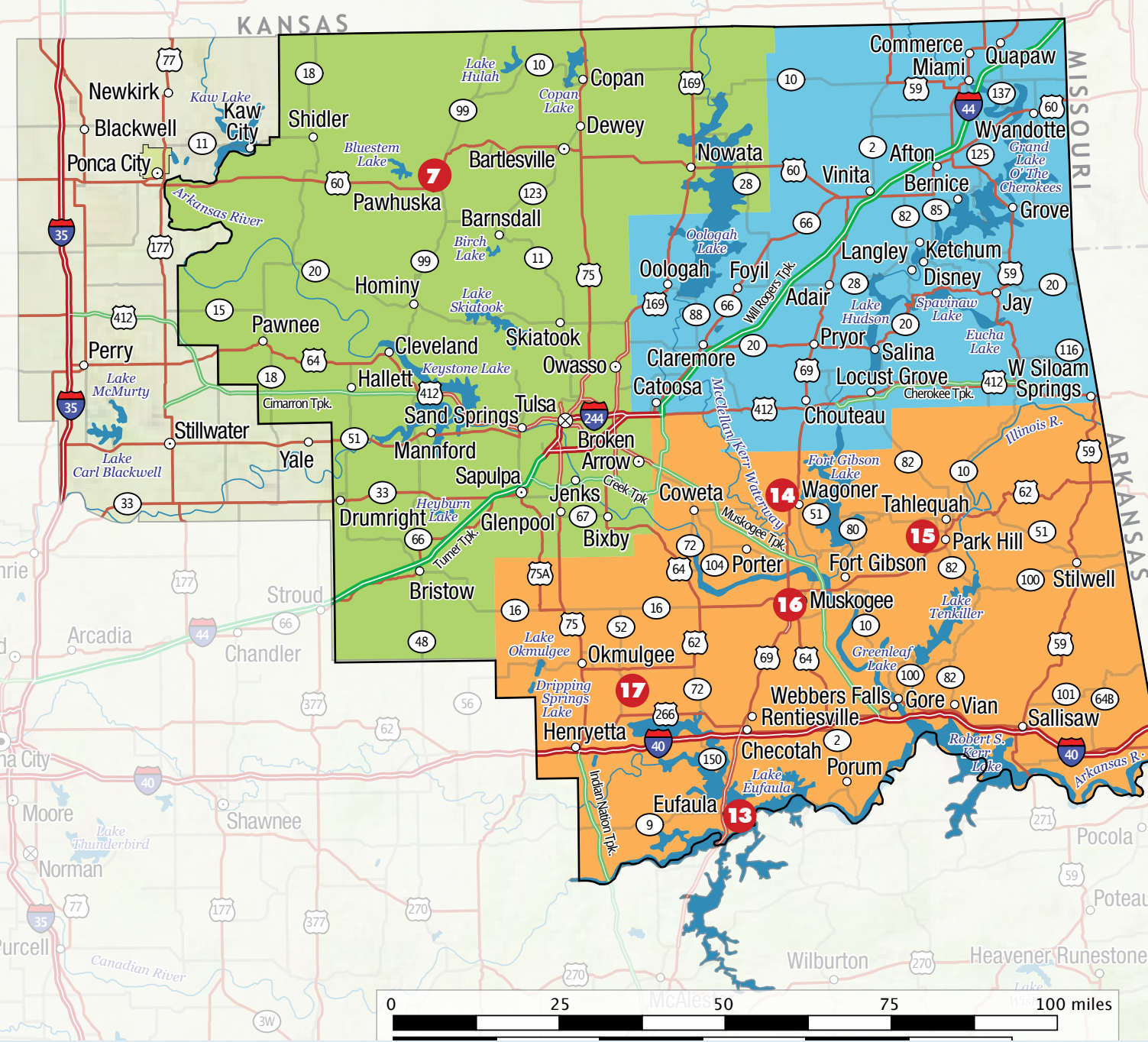

**8 DOBSON HOME - ONE OF AMERICA'S TOP 20 MOST BEAUTIFUL LAKES**

The museum houses artifacts encompassing all areas of Ottawa County's vast history including agriculture, mining, military, industry, and Native American tribes. The historic Dobson Home was completed in January 1916 by Solomon B. Dobson family. It is a beautiful venue adorned with a beautiful garden surrounding the property. **9 PENSACOLA DAM**

The art deco design and massive size of the Pensacola Dam combine to make it one of the most impressive structures in NE Oklahoma. Constructed by the Grand River Dam Authority during the Great Depression, it was the first hydroelectric project in Oklahoma and still produces much needed power for the state. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, it holds back 46,500 surface acres of water to create Grand Lake.
